





Homework Expectations - Year Six


In Year 6, you will be set daily homework. We feel that this change in moving from weekly to daily homework is important as it not only provides you with the opportunity to consolidate your learning at home but it also helps to prepare you for secondary school.

Daily

 <p>Reading</p>	<p>As previously mentioned, you are expected to read for a minimum of 15 minutes every night and to complete a reading comprehension question response in your reading record. We would ask that you read aloud to an adult at least once a week with them commenting and signing your reading record.</p> <p>Reading records should be brought to school every day.</p>
 <p>Daily Maths</p>	<p>Each day you be given 5 maths questions to answer in your maths homework book. This will give you the chance to consolidate prior learning.</p> <p>This book must be returned to school every day.</p>
 <p>Spelling</p>	<p>Each week you will have two spelling tests (Monday and Thursday).</p> <p>You will be given a spelling rule and 10 spellings on a Monday to learn, then a different rule and 10 spellings to learn on a Thursday. You will be assigned a spelling task to complete each night. This should be completed in your pink homework book.</p> <p>This book must be brought to school every day.</p>
 <p>Times Tables</p>	<p>You must complete a minimum of 25 minutes each week. We recommend that this is completed by practising for a minimum of 5 minutes each day.</p> <p>The time spent is calculated from that spent answering questions and not the time spent on the website. This will be checked on a Monday.</p>

We will go through the maths and spelling homework with you every day and further teaching will be provided if required. Please remember to bring your books to school **every day** as continued failure to bring completed work to school will result in working during lunchtimes and missing playtime.

Weekly

 <p>THE WEEK Junior</p>	<p>Each week an article will be posted onto Google Classroom. We expect you to read the article, engage in a discussion at home about what you have read and post a comment on the class Google Classroom page. This will you in developing your literacy and oracy skills. This will be check on a Wednesday.</p>
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
